### This week in school...

The snowy weather that we have had this week coincided beautifully with Willow Class'

topic about the Polar Regions. The children have been learning about Arctic and Antarctic



animals. They have made lovely collages showing the icy environment and written some fascinating facts about penguins and polar bears.



This week, the children in **Oak Class** have once again been thoroughly enjoying their learning and have been investing lots of effort into all of their activities. They have continued to follow the adventures of 'Traction Man' by reading the second book in the series and the children have started to plan their very own Traction



Man adventure. In their art lesson, the children enjoyed finding out about the life of Pablo Picasso and then worked with so much enthusiasm to create some detailed fact files about him. As you can see from the wonderful display pictured, Oak Class children have even experimented with drawing portraits in the style of Picasso.

The children in **Beech Class** had a fun gymnastics lesson in PE this week. They enjoyed using the apparatus and practised their jumping skills. In science, the children began learning about the three different types of rocks; 'igneous', 'sedimentary' and 'metamorphic'. They asked lots of interesting questions and brought some of their own rock/gem collections in from home for everyone to look at. In art, the children planned their own monster sculpture which will be made out of a cardboard tube – photographs to follow in next week's newsletter!



The children in **Elm Class** have worked really hard this week in maths lessons on their multiplication and division unit of work. They have been learning how to multiply a 3-digit number by a 1-digit number and all of the children have shown brilliant perseverance. In English lessons, the children have learned how to plan a persuasive speech and have already written their introductions. The children are using persuasive techniques to influence their

listeners and readers. The class are going to read out their persuasive speeches to Beech Class when they are finished.

In **Sycamore Class** this week, the children have been learning about Earth and Space. They have learnt about the Flat Earth and Spherical Earth theories and have weighed the evidence for both theories, before coming up with their own conclusions. They have also drawn and labelled the different planets, as well as creating a poster about Space. They have worked hard in maths lessons focusing on fractions and in English lessons they have finished writing up their presentations, ready to perform in front of Elm Class soon. During their PE lesson, half of the children enjoyed practising their football skills, whilst the other half enjoyed building dens in Forest School.

This week has flown by in **Maple Class!** The snow has caused great excitement and, as you can see from the photo, has also inspired some lovely, scaled down, snowman sculptures. The children have enjoyed their second swimming lesson where they are beginning to work towards their awards. Computing was a noted highlight this week, along with creating more Clarice Cliff inspired patterns and as well as reading more of The Nowhere Emporium. The children have been planning their own 'Wonders' using powerful vocabulary to create suspense. The school house captains held a successful meeting and the librarians are enjoying taking responsibility for keeping the library tidy and useable.
