

Wow Willow Class! What a fantastic start to the new school year. Year 1 children have shown what lovely and considerate pupils they are this week, They have welcomed the new reception children into school and been helpful and kind friends. Our reception children have joined our school with amazing confidence and enthusiasm. They have enjoyed engaging in every area of the classroom, worked hard to learn new sounds in their phonics sessions and showed some super maths skills. Well done children!



We have welcomed several new children to our school and they have quickly settled in due to the school values of 'fellowship' and 'compassion' that they have been shown by their classmates. All of the children have been full of enthusiasm and have quickly adapted to the classroom routines. They have already made a great start with their learning in different areas. This week the children have really enjoyed learning about different poems from the book 'Poems Aloud' by Joseph Coehlo, culminating in their super performance of the poem 'Funny Fish' during the celebration assembly on Friday.

The children in Beech Class have settled well into their first (very hot!) week back at school. They have been getting used to the new routines and have particularly enjoyed going on the activity trail at break times now that they are in KS2. In English, the children have been working on poetry. They have written their own poems and practised reciting some tongue twisters, which they then performed brilliantly in assembly on Friday. In maths, the children have been representing and partitioning 2-digit numbers in preparation for working on 3-digit numbers next week. An excellent first week!



### Fellowship - Compassion - Respect - Perseverance - Thankfulness - Service

The children have settled well into Elm Class this week. They have started their Year 4 learning with enthusiasm. Like the other classes, this has included learning poems from the book, 'Poems Aloud' by Paul Coehlo and reciting a tongue twister with



actions in assembly. They have started topics on Animals including Humans in Science and The Ancient Egyptians in History. We have all enjoyed teaching the children this week.

This children in Sycamore Class have enjoyed getting straight into their learning. They have been colouring, collaging and painting for an RE display based on God. They have also enjoyed practising ball skills in PE with the children from Elm Class. In Science, the children have been learning about different forces including friction, gravity, buoyancy and air/water resistance, and have identified which forces act on which objects. They have



also practised their handwriting, working really hard to use leading lines. In maths, the children have used counters and base 10 objects to represent different numbers up to 2,000,000 and in English they have been learning poetry written by Joseph Coelho. The children enjoyed reading tongue twisters and making up riddles. They practised and performed the poem 'something wondrous' in front of the school in assembly with great confidence and volume.

Maple have settled into the new term beautifully! The children have shown a really positive attitude towards all their learning this week, being particularly impressive at learning a selection of tongue twisters! In PE they practised tennis skills and managed some impressive rallies too. All in all, a lovely start to the new school year.
