Willow Class have had a very busy week of learning! Our reception children completed their bikeability sessions and all worked really hard to develop their balancing skills. On Thursday afternoon, they enjoyed an activity with Mrs Munden where they set up a maze and worked brilliantly as a team to navigate their way around it. Our Year 1 children have enjoyed sharing a new book 'No, Nancy, No!' The children made predictions about the book and wrote labels for the characters, author and

title. They have also started to use adjectives to describe the character Nancy and had made a super effort to apply their phonics knowledge to exciting vocabulary.

It has been another busy week in **Oak Class!** In English lessons, the children have really enjoyed starting to read their new class text 'Katie in London' and have been working hard to write some interesting sentences to recount the story so far. In their History lesson, the children started to learn about what London was like in the past and compare it with modern day London, enjoying using a range of sources to extend their knowledge.





In English, the children in **Beech Class** have been reading a story called 'The Wonder' by Faye Hanson. They then had to use different sentence openers, and adventurous words and phrases to describe the beautiful pictures in the story. In Maths, the children have begun learning about 3-digit numbers; identifying hundreds, tens and ones and representing them in different ways. In Science, the children learnt about nutrition and the five different food groups. They then sorted examples of food into

the correct groups. In Geography, the children learnt about the eight points of a compass and practised using them to answer a series of questions. The week finished with Group 1 completing an 'unnatural' scavenger hunt in their first Forest School session, and Group 2 having a fun PE lesson with Mr H from Progressive Sports.

The children in **Elm Class** have been writing some amazing similes and metaphors based on the book, 'Leon and the Place Between' by Grahame Baker Smith. Here are some examples of them:

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'It's like a silver fluttering butterfly'

'The stars are golden flowers'

'The clouds are purple and blue candyfloss'.

The children in **Sycamore Class** have had a fantastic time with Bikeability,

practising their cycling skills and learning how to be safe on their bikes. They have also been learning about symbols and keys on a map. They matched different symbols with what they represent and then created their own. In Science, the children have been learning about forces and thought carefully about which forces effect different objects. In Art, they have

been drawing in the style of William Morris, copying one of his drawings to see his style and technique. In RE, they have thought about how they would describe God and what Christians think of him.



This week, the children in **Maple Class** have begun planning their Mr Men or Little Miss books. They have watched some of the original videos and read lots of the books to analyse how they are written to ensure their own versions are in the same style. During their art lesson, the children started to learn about Salvador Dali and his stylish moustaches! With lots of practise, the children's tennis skills are improving - Wimbledon here we come.
