

Willow Class children have worked hard this week in all areas of their learning. We have enjoyed seeing lots of independent learning from the reception children including, writing their names as labels for models which they had built, writing new sounds from their phonics sessions, and practising their cutting skills. The Year 1 children have worked hard to plan and write sentences in their English lessons. They have used pictures from the story 'No, Nancy,



No!' and recorded sentences to explain the pictures also remembering to use capital letters, full stops and adding adjectives. The Year 1 children have also begun to develop their understanding of the countries within the United Kingdom. They used playdough and a map to show the 4 different countries and worked in small groups to attach labels to their map. Well done children!

This week in **Oak Class**, the children have really enjoyed learning about jobs that people would have held during the 17th century. During their History lesson, they used several sources to explore the differences between fire men in 1666 and fire people now. In PSHE, they deepened their understanding of Road Safety by exploring a scenario and considering the different choices that could be made and the



consequences these could have. Both Year 1 and 2 children have continued to develop their place value skills during maths lessons, with Year 1 focussing on counting on from a given number and recognising one more and less, whilst Year 2 have been learning how to place numbers on number lines with intervals of 10 and 100, and estimating numbers on number lines.

The children in **Beech Class** have been learning about vertebrates and invertebrates in Science; identifying examples of each and sorting them into two groups. They were very interested to watch a video of an octopus (an invertebrate) squeezing through an extremely small space! In RE, the children learnt about the Trinity and how Christians believe God is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In Art, the children are learning about Banksy; the graffiti artist. This week they designed their own tag, which is like an artist's signature. In Geography, the children created a sketch map of the school and included symbols on a key. To finish the week, Group 2 had their first Forest School session, and Group 1 enjoyed learning invasion tactics in PE.

In **Elm Class**, the children have been learning about different types of teeth in science this week. They enjoyed looking at their own teeth and at their friends'. After this, they learnt the names of the different types of teeth and the function of the teeth types. The class also compared human teeth to the teeth of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores If you have pets at home, perhaps you could look at their



teeth to see the different types (mind your fingers though!)

In **Sycamore Class**, the children have worked hard in maths ordering and comparing numbers, as well as rounding different numbers. They practised their skills with numbers up to 5 million. In English, the children have been looking carefully at different persuasive letters and identifying what makes a letter persuasive. They have also started researching the Victorian Workhouses, finding lots of facts about the awful conditions within them. In Science, the children learnt about Isaac Newton and measured different objects to find their weight and mass. In Geography, the children looked at different maps and found the grid references of different symbols, focusing on four and six grid references. In PSHE, the children have discussed different ways to keep safe and what to do in a risky situation.

The children in **Maple Class** have completed their impressive Salvador Dali portraits with added expressive moustaches, as you can see in the picture. The Mr Men and Little Miss stories continue to be worked on with the introductory pages now completed in rough. During their History lesson, the children have created posters inspired by a collection of historical artefacts becoming experts on all sorts of WWII related topics. Despite the torrential rain on Wednesday, the class enjoyed a busy PE morning including playing 'Pass the Frog' and indoor tennis using hand mits.
