# Mr P Hayward: Headteacher

# Friday 13th October 2023

Willow Class children have had a super week of learning this week. To begin their new unit of writing in English, they had to predict who their new story book character was. The children were given clues including a suitcase containing a hat, coat, label and marmalade sandwiches. There were some fantastic predictions, with many guessing the character correctly as Paddington Bear. The Year 1 children have enjoyed learning about part-whole models in maths and wrote addition number sentences to represent these. The Reception children have enjoyed practising their number formation, matching quantities to numerals and creating different representations for the number 4.

In **Oak Class**, the children really enjoyed working in pairs during English to study a poem from the anthology 'The London Bus.' They illustrated copies of the poems beautifully to create a new classroom display. During PSHE, Year 2 children created their own cardboard shoes to practise tying their shoelaces whilst Year 1 have been demonstrating their knowledge of Road Safety by making posters in groups. In their History lesson, the children developed their chronology skills by forming and then recording a timeline of the key events from The Great Fire of London.



In Maths this week, the children in **Beech Class** have started learning about addition and subtraction. They have been using their number bonds to and within 10 to help them complete calculations with larger numbers; e.g. 3+1=4 so 30+10=40 and 300+100=400. In English, the children have started their next unit of writing about instructions and explanations. This week, they have had fun giving verbal instructions to a partner. They had to include time connectives and imperative (bossy) verbs, instructing their partners to complete a drawing. In Art, the children have started to make their graffiti stencils and will begin painting next week. In Geography, the children have been using atlases to locate the main cities of the UK. They then labelled them on their own maps. The week ended with our lovely Harvest celebration, and Beech Class did a super job performing their poem!

In **Sycamore Class**, the children have been learning about rivers and their features in Geography. In English, they have enjoyed writing up letters on laptops. In Science, they enjoyed using plasticine in an experiment to see the effects on water resistance on different shapes. They observed how streamlined shapes have less water resistance, so therefore go faster. Over the whole week, the children have enjoyed rehearsing for their harvest performance, practising their song and poem, which they performed beautifully in the village hall. They all worked really hard on their performance and should be so proud of themselves.

Maple Class has had another busy, challenging but enjoyable week. The children have all taken part in their Level 2 Bikeability course and passed with flying colours; with many compliments from their course leaders. After a lot of hard work, the Mr Men books have been completed and once they are put together will look brilliant. The children in Maple Class are now looking forward to sharing them with children in Willow and Oak Classes before half term. The week was topped off by the Harvest Festival Service. All the children performed brilliantly and should be very proud of themselves.
