The children in **Willow Class** enjoyed a range of activities this week. They thoroughly enjoyed learning some new skills on Wednesday when playing squash. The children worked hard practising their throwing and catching skills, they also enjoyed using the rackets to hit the ball in the squash court. During PE and at their Christmas play rehearsals, the children have learnt dance routines to perform during the production, 'Lights, Camel, Action!' They enjoy listening to the music, learning the lyrics and adding the actions too.

The rehearsals for the KS1 and Reception Christmas play are in full swing and the children in **Oak Class** are thoroughly enjoying singing and dancing. The Year 2 actors are working really hard to project their voices and deliver their lines with expression. In English this week, Oak Class were excited to find out what happened at the end of their class text 'The Baker's Boy and the Great Fire of London' and have identified, ordered and recalled the key events in the story. In Maths lessons, Year 2 have been learning about the sides and vertices of 2D shapes, whilst Year 1 children have been consolidating their understanding of place value up to 20.

In RE, the children in **Beech Class** learnt about the Ten Commandments. They found out that God gave them to Moses when he prayed to God for help. The children discussed which they thought were the most important and put them in order accordingly. In computing,

the children learnt about computer networks. They were challenged to create their own network by passing messages around the classroom without moving from their seats. They then found out that putting a network switch in helps to speed up the process with messages being sent directly from the sender to the receiver. In History, the children started to learn about the Roman Empire. They found out how the Roman Empire started and how it became so successful. On Wednesday, the children had a fantastic time in their PE lesson with the visiting squash coaches. They learnt some basic squash skills and had a whole class rally.





The children in **Elm Class** have been making the most of the frosty days this week. The children have been listening to, writing and sharing different types of syllabic poems, all with the theme of *WINTER*. Wrapping up warmly, they went out looking for inspiration and were fascinated by the tiny icicles on leaves, the crunchy sounds their feet made on the frozen ground, the long shadows caused by the low sun, and the way everything sparkled in the sun.

In **Sycamore Class**, the children have been learning about Fu Hao in History and how from the different artefacts found in her tomb, we can learn about her. Just like archaeologists. In Science, the children have been looking at soluble and insoluble materials and seeing what materials dissolve in water. In Maths, the children have been comparing and adding fractions, changing denominators and converting improper fractions into mixed numbers. In DT, the children have been sawing pieces of wood to make chassis ready for their own motor car. In English, the children have started writing their own Just So Stories, thinking of imaginative ways an animal can get a feature and adding lots of description. In Computing, the children have been looking at different search engines and seeing how to use them correctly and efficiently.

In **Maple Class**, the highlights have been (according to the children): learning how to play Squash and managing a rally of 68 hits; creating circuits and watching lightbulbs light up and adding a switch to turn them on and off; reading 'Letters from the Lighthouse' as it is getting very exciting; helping put the stage out for the KS1 and Reception production; non-uniform day; learning more about fractions and finally putting the Christmas decorations on the Christmas Tree.

Christmas Cards

A tradition at St Andrew's is to not give out Christmas cards to people who we see every day but instead use the money we would spend on the cards to improve the lives of those less fortunate. From Monday 4th December, the children will be able to "purchase" a Christmas message card. The cards will be displayed in school and then they will be read out to the school on the last day. All money raised will be used to support Oxfam's charity work. Donations for Christmas message cards will be able to be made via Parent Pay.



Heavy Snowfall

In the case of a heavy snowfall we will endeavour to open school. Closing a school is always a last resort. The safety of the school site, whether staff can get to work, of those that can get
