What a busy week the children in **Willow Class** have had! Our Reception children had a very soggy trip to Marquis Drive on Wednesday. The children enjoyed a craft activity, outside den building and teamwork challenges. They also enjoyed toasting marshmallows and drinking a cup of hot chocolate. The children were also treated to a visit from Santa! The children behaved brilliantly and had lots of fun! We have been really impressed by the writing from our Year 1 children this week, they have been busy writing Santa letters but have also created a book to explain the events of the Great Fire of London. The children wrote thoughtful sentences and designed their book covers.



In **Oak Class** this week, the children used a range measuring, cutting and sticking techniques to add details onto their fire engine models in DT. They added windows, stripy reflective strips, hoses and a ladder. Next will be the axle and wheels, which they have learned all about. A highlight of the week was of course writing to Father Christmas! Every child has written a lovely letter with some really kind comments and thoughtful questions, as well as some polite gift requests. Let's see if Father Christmas and his helpers have time to reply before the end of term!

The children in **Beech Class** have been working very hard on their autumn term assessments this week. For one task, they



had to write an alternative ending to the traditional tale; Little Red Riding Hood. In PE, the children continued with their dance lessons. This week, they had to create movement phrases around the theme of deforestation. The children worked sensibly and creatively to incorporate movements that showed the effects of this process.

Once again, the children in **Elm Class** braved the cold, rainy, winter weather in the pursuit of knowledge by going on a bug hunt as part of their science topic. Although most of the bugs seemed to be hiding from the cold, some children found worms, centipedes, and slugs. The children took the insects back into the classroom, made some detailed drawings which they labelled using the correct scientific vocabulary they have been learning.



In **Sycamore Class**, the children have worked hard with their assessments, showing their understanding of their learning over the past term. Also, they have enjoyed gluing together the chassis of their cars in DT ready for next week when they will add an electrical circuit with a motor to make them move. The children have written excellent stories in English based on how animals develop their features e.g. how the elephant gets its trunk. In PE, they enjoyed having a game of basketball, showing off their dribbling and shooting

techniques. In Forest School, they used wood and other natural resources to create a Christmas decoration.

The children in **Maple Class** have been tackling their assessments with a very sensible and positive attitude. Six boys represented the school at a wheelchair basketball tournament and came back very excited and triumphant! During their PE lesson, the children developed their balance, strength and agility skills using the large equipment in the hall. The children are nearing the end of their class novel 'Letters from the Lighthouse and are enjoying 'Popcorn Reading' around the class.

On Monday, the children are warmly invited to attend one of two school Christmas discos. The first will be for the children in Willow and Oak Classes and will take place during the school day in the afternoon. The second disco will take place at 3.30pm and will end at 5.00pm.
